

DESCRIPTION OF THE VARIABLES OF THE FILE “WOMEN”

Data were collected through a questionnaire that was divided into the following ten parts:

- Section 1: HOUSEHOLD CHARACTERISTICS
- Section 2: PARENTAL HOME
- Section 3: PARTNERSHIP
- Section 4: PREGNANCIES AND CHILDREN
- Section 5: CURRENT FERTILITY REGULATION
- Section 6: FUTURE FERTILITY AND VIEWS ON HAVING CHILDREN
- Section 7: EDUCATIONAL CAREER
- Section 8: OCCUPATIONAL CAREER
- Section 9: SPOUSE/COHABITING PARTNER CHARACTERISTICS AND RELIGIOUSNESS
- Section 10: OPINIONS

There was also an eleventh section, for the interviewer:

- Section 11: SECTION FOR THE INTERVIEWER

For women, there were two different questionnaires. The questionnaire D1 was implemented to half of the women interviewed, while the questionnaire D2 to the other half (in order to balance and relieve the burden of the questions). The differences between the two concern the special questions – not core ones – added to D1 and omitted in D2 (2.10, 2.11, 2.12, 9.2, 9.13, 9.14, 9.15, 10.1, 10.6, 10.8), and a set of items (10.12) inserted in D2 only.
