For women, there were two different questionnaires. The questionnaire D1 was implemented to half of the women interviewed, while the questionnaire D2 to the other half (in order to balance and relieve the burden of the questions). The differences between the two concern the special questions – not core ones – added to D1 and omitted in D2 (2.10, 2.11, 2.12, 9.2, 9.13, 9.14, 9.15, 10.1, 10.6, 10.8), and a set of items (10.12) inserted in D2 only.
